

and players in their team uniforms probably come to mind. Thousands of years ago, the atmosphere on a Mayan playing field in Mexico was much the same, except for one thing. If a team lost, then a human sacrifice was performed and it was usually the captain or coach of the losing team!

In the Mayan game of Pok-a-tok, there were two teams of seven players. All the players were members of the nobility and the spectators were people from different classes.

Archaeologists have found over 600 ball courts of varying shapes and sizes in Mexico. All of the courts have two sloping walls facing each other, with three round disks that probably served as nets of some kind. It seems that the object of the game was for players to keep a ball in the air using every part of their body except for their hands.

Ancient Meso-Americans loved a good show. The ballplayers walked onto the court wearing fine jewellery, animal skins, and feathered headdresses. During the game, however, they wore protective gear that allowed for quick movement. The ball usually weighed as much as an average-sized watermelon. It had the ability to break bones or even kill!

The Meso-Americans believed that by playing this game correctly, they were serving their gods well. They believed that, in return, the gods would provide bountiful crops and good health for their people.


